NOTICE TO BIDDERS

February 5, 2026

Skokomish RM 6.5 Habitat Restoration Project MCD Contract #2026-02

MASON CONSERVATION DISTRICT is requesting bids from qualified parties to help restore river, wetland, and floodplain habitat on the Skokomish River in Mason County, Washington. The project includes the construction of 21 large woody material (LWM) structures (10 of which are pile supported) in the Skokomish River. Specifically, this includes 1 Mid-Channel Jam, 3 Bar Roughening Jams, 11 Bank Jam units (each unit is approximately forty-five (45) feet in length, creating 5 Bank Jam structures in total) and 6 Deflector Jams. The project will also create and improve of 0.6 miles of new floodplain side channels that includes the construction of 13 Wood Habitat Structures (Side Channel Type A and Type B Jams) within said side channels, the decommissioning of an the existing recreational parking area and creation of a new elevated recreational parking area in the upland area, demolition and removal of an existing vault toilet from the floodplain and installation of a new prefabricated single vault toilet in the new upland parking area, and improvement of an established access route to the river from the new parking area.

A total of approximately 209 large and medium logs (some with rootwads still attached), 55 timber piles, 355 racking logs, 12 pinning logs, and 436 cubic yards of slash material will need to be harvested or procured by the contractor and delivered to the project site for the construction of 21 large wood structures in the main stem and 13 smaller habitat structures in the side channels. Approximately 6,560 cubic yards of material will be excavated to construct or enhance 0.6 miles of new or enhanced flood plain side channels. Suitable soil material from side channel excavation is the designated borrow source for the proposed parking lot embankment and any roadway subgrade fill. It's estimated that 1,250 cubic yards of subgrade fill material will be required for the parking lot embankment and roadway subgrade fill. Excavated side channel material that is not utilized on-site as fill (approximately 5,310 cubic yards) shall be properly disposed of off-site by the Contractor.

The construction of the LWM structures will occur at or below the ordinary high-water mark (OHWM) and must be completed within the permitted in-water work window defined by the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife's (WDFW) project Hydraulic Project Approval (HPA) permit. Work at or below the OHWM must occur between July 15, 2026, and September 15, 2026. All Work must be substantially complete by September 30, 2026. This is a public works contract requiring payment of prevailing wages in accordance with Washington State laws.

BIDS will be received for the **Skokomish RM 6.5 Habitat Restoration Project (Range \$1,000,000-\$2,500,000) until March 25, 2026, at 10:00 A.M.**, at which time they will be publicly opened and read at the Mason Conservation District office located at 450 W. Business Park Rd., Shelton, WA 98584. A **mandatory job show** will be held on **February 25, 2026, at 10:00 A.M.**, meeting at the project site. Specifically, the WDFW boat launch parking area on the north side of the Skokomish River on N. Sunnyside Rd (1.4 miles from Sunnyside's intersection with U.S. highway 101, coordinates 47.319682, -123.200889). Attendance at the job show is mandatory for bid submission. Bidders may submit questions by way of email to Matt Phillips at mphillips@masoncd.org. All questions must be submitted by email prior to 5 P.M. on March 11th, 2026. All responses will be published on <http://bxwa.com> by the end of day, March 16th, 2026.

MAJOR BID ITEMS will include: Mobilization, lump sum (L.S.); Project Temporary Traffic Control, L.S.; Project Clean-up, L.S.; Temporary Access Roads, L.S.; Clearing and Grubbing, acres (AC.); Remove Existing Vault Toilet Building, L.S.; Side Channel Excavation Incl. Haul, cubic yards (C.Y.); Parking Lot Embankment & Roadway Subgrade Earthwork, Incl. Haul, C.Y.; Parking Lot, WDFW Access Road, & Vehicle Pullouts (6" Crushed Surfacing Base Course) C.Y.; Permanent Stream Crossing, Ford (Rock for Erosion & Scour Protection, Class A) C.Y.; Permanent Stream Crossing, Ford (Streambed Sediment) C.Y.; Single Vault Toilet, L.S.; Single Arm – Access Control Gate, each (EA.); Remove Existing Culvert Under Access Road Incl. Bidders are encouraged to “Register” in order to receive automatic email notification of future addenda and job shows, and to place themselves on the self-registered “Bidders List.” This on-line plan room provides Bidders with fully useable on-line documents, with the ability to: download, print to your own printer, order full/partial plan sets from numerous reprographic sources (on-line print order form), and a free on-line digitizer/take-off tool. ALL BID PROPOSALS shall be accompanied by a bid proposal deposit in the form of a Surety Bond, Cash, Cashier's Check, or Certified Check in an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the amount of such bid proposal. **The Proposal Bond shall be on DOT Form 272-001 revised 08/2001 for Local Agency Use.** Should the successful bidder fail to enter into such contract and furnish satisfactory performance bond within the time stated in the Specifications, the bid proposal deposit shall be forfeited to Mason Conservation District.

ALL BID PROPOSALS must be received on or before the day and hour of the above-mentioned bid opening. Bid Proposals must be in writing or electronically filled out on forms

furnished from the **Builders Exchange of Washington**, along with proposal deposit. Bid Proposals (including all required attachments) shall be submitted to Mason Conservation District by one of the following methods:

1. Attach and email Bid documents to accounting@masoncd.org. Bid documents containing required initials and signatures must be signed using a digital signature. Emails containing the attached completed Bids shall include, in the email title, the project name and Bidder's name. **After bid submittal, please send a separate email to accounting@masoncd.org requesting confirmation that Mason Conservation District received the submitted bid.**
2. Deliver (in person or through parcel/ mail carrier) hard copy Bid documents in a sealed 12" x 9" envelope, with an indication on the front bottom left corner of said envelope, the project name, name of bidder, and date and time of opening. Deliver Bid documents to:

Proposals that are received as required will be publicly opened and read on the day and hour of the above-mentioned bid opening. Mason Conservation District will not open or consider any Bid Proposal that is received after the bid opening date and time or received in a location other than that specified in this Notice to Bidders. Bidders are **not** required to be present at the public opening of Bid Proposals.

MASON CONSERVATION DISTRICT reserves the right to accept or reject bids on each item separately or as a whole, to reject any or all bids, to waive informalities and to contract as to the best interest of the Mason Conservation District. It is the intent of Mason Conservation District to award a contract to the lowest cost responsible bidder. Before award, the bidder must meet the following Bidder Responsibility and Supplemental Bidder Responsibility Criteria to be considered a responsible bidder. The bidder may be required by Mason Conservation District to submit documentation demonstrating compliance with the criteria.

Mandatory Bidder Responsibility Criteria:

1. At the time of bid submittal, have a current certificate of registration as a contractor in compliance with RCW 18.27;
2. Have a current Washington Unified Business Identifier (UBI) number;
3. If applicable:
 - a. Have Industrial Insurance (workers' compensation) coverage for the bidder's employees working in Washington, as required in RCW 51;
 - b. Have a Washington Employment Security Department number, as required in RCW 50;
 - c. Have a Washington Department of Revenue state excise tax registration number, as required in RCW 82;
4. Not be disqualified from bidding on any public works contract under RCW 39.06.010 or 39.12.065(3).
5. Shall be active and in good standing with the Washington State Secretary of State's Office, the Department of Revenue, and the Department of Labor & Industries;
6. Within the three-year period immediately preceding the date of the bid solicitation, not have been determined by a final and binding citation and notice of assessment issued by the department of labor and industries or through a civil judgment entered by a court of

limited or general jurisdiction to have willfully violated, as defined in RCW 49.48.082, any provision of RCW 49.46, 49.48, or 49.52. A bidder shall submit a signed “**Certification of Compliance with Wage Payment Statutes**” form with the bid form regarding this wage theft prevention responsible bidder criteria.

- a. Submit a signed statement in accordance with RCW 9A.72.085 verifying under penalty of perjury that the bidder is in compliance with the responsible bidder criteria requirement of section 5, above.
7. Submit a completed “**Mandatory Bidder Responsibility Checklist**” form with bid proposal.

Supplemental Bidder Responsibility Criteria: In addition to the Mandatory Bidder Responsibility Criteria referenced above, each bidder must also complete and submit the “**Supplemental Bidder Responsibility Criteria**” form with their bid proposal. The three (3) past jobs references listed by the bidder should be projects of comparable size and scope that demonstrate the ability to work within permit guidelines for “in water work” that include river diversions, pumping, and/ or cofferdams as well as completing projects of similar size and scope, including the installation of engineered log jams below the OHWM. The referenced projects should also demonstrate the bidder’s experience and qualifications in conducting such work in a timely manner. At least one of the three (3) referenced projects shall have a project cost totaling at least \$1,000,000.

If Mason Conservation District determines that the low bidder does not meet the Bidder Responsibility Criteria above and is therefore not a responsible bidder, Mason Conservation District shall notify the bidder in writing with the reasons for its determination. If the bidder disagrees with this determination, it may appeal the determination within 24 hours of receipt of Mason Conservation District’s determination by presenting additional information to Mason Conservation District. Mason Conservation District will consider the additional information before issuing its final determination. If the final determination affirms that the bidder is not responsible, Mason Conservation District will not execute a contract with any other bidder until two (2) business days after the bidder determined to be not responsible has received the final determination.
